Dear Friends in Christ,



If you have gone shopping recently, more than likely you were greeted upon arrival with words such as, *Welcome to Value Mart. How may I help you?*

help you? You probably found that for most retail stores these were empty words. Pope Francis often reminds new bishops that their ministry is primarily a ministry of service. Of all the many titles for the Pope, his favorite is Servant of the Servants of God. All Christians, not just the Pope and bishops are called to serve. When we as church say “*how may I help you?*” these words should be true.

In today’s Gospel Jesus has just spoken about his impending death for a third time. However, his own apostles do not seem to have heard him. The brothers James and John want something from Jesus—a share in His glory. And they will receive this gift, even though they don’t quite understand it. They look past the suffering and service.

Once again we have the privilege of celebrating the Eucharist on the Lord’s Day. The Eucharistic is a gift that we do not deserve, but desperately need. Let us recall that this gift we are given is to be shared. It is nourishment so that we might ask: *How may I help?*

God's Work of Salvation

God’s work of salvation is the focus of this weekend’s readings. From the prophetic event of Isaiah to Jesus’ understanding of the human condition in Hebrews, concluding with Jesus paying our ransom in Mark, God is in control. There may be failings and misunderstandings along the way. We may move away from God, but at our conversion, God leads us back. Like James and John, we may let greed and power blur our vision of what Jesus wants us to know about the Kingdom; but tirelessly we are taught and re-taught what life in the Kingdom will be. Jesus has paid our ransom to ensure that we will share in the Kingdom.

It is not unusual to think of Jesus’ ransom as a punishment that he endured. However, it is more accurate, and more like Jesus, for us to recognize ransom as God’s gift to us.

The Readings and their Message

Isaiah 53:10-11

Suffering was viewed as a punishment for sins and transgressions. And yet, here the Servant of God is completely innocent but carries the errors of everyone, as a sacrificial lamb. The suffering of the innocent is troublesome. It always presents uncomfortable questions that are difficult to answer. If God causes suffering or allows those who have no wrongdoing to suffer, it must mean that he is unjust and if he cannot prevent suffering, then he is a powerless God. In both cases, it challenges the idea of a just and powerful God. The Servant of God who is presented here takes on the suffering of the world and voluntarily accepts it to bring countless others, the knowledge and love of God, to salvation.

Hebrews 4:14-16

In this reading we see a high priest that understands the sufferings and weaknesses of the people because he has endured them. Here we have an affirmation from the community regarding the identity of Jesus, Son of God and High Priest. Just like the high priest entered into the presence of God and offered sacrifices, Christ with his own blood entered into the presence of God following his Death and Passion.

Mark 10:35-45

In spite of the many announcements Jesus made regarding his own Passion, the disciples still failed to understand. It is difficult to belong to such a community, where some aspired to occupy the top positions and others were irritated by such ambition. The disciples, like all humans, were tempted by selfishness, vanity, the desire for power, ambition, jealousy, and envy. When Jesus responds to James and John's desire to sit next to him in the highest positions of the kingdom, he asserts that it is not in his hands to concede such positions, although he does not deny that he himself will sit at the right hand of God. In this way he affirms that there are no positions of honor in the Kingdom of God, but those who wish to follow Jesus there, must endure the same fate he did. In other words, to be plunged into the same waters and drink from the same cup as Jesus did. To participate in the Death and Resurrection of Jesus demands devotion and most of the time this means sacrifice, service and generosity, not prestige.

Nuestro Papa Francisco a menudo les hace recordar a nuevos obispos que su ministerio es principalmente un ministerio de servicio. De todos los diversos títulos para el Papa, su favorito es Siervo de los Siervos de Dios. Todos los cristianos, no sólo el Papa y los obispos están llamados a servir. LA OBRA DIVINA DE SALVACIÓN

La obra de Dios de la salvación es el enfoque de las lecturas este fin de semana. Desde el acontecer profético de Isaías hasta la visión de Jesús sobre la condición humana en Hebreos, y terminando con el rescate que paga Jesús por nosotros en san Marcos, Dios está al mando. Puede que ocurran caídas e incomprendiciones por el camino. Puede que nos alejemos de Dios, pero Dios nos trae de vuelta a su lado mediante la conversión. Al igual que Santiago y Juan, a veces dejamos que la avaricia y el poder empañen nuestra visión de lo que Jesús nos quiere enseñar sobre el Reino; pero sin tregua nos enseña y nos repite cómo ha de ser la vida en el Reino. Jesús ha pagado por nuestro rescate para garantizar que compartamos el Reino con él.

No es raro que pensemos sobre el rescate que pagó Jesús en términos de un castigo que tuvo que sufrir. Sin embargo, es más acertado y más como Jesús, reconocer que el rescate es un regalo de Dios para nosotros.

Todo se mueve por el amor

Las Lecturas y su mensaje

Isaías 53:10-11

Las desgracias se veían como castigo a los pecados y las transgresiones; y, sin embargo, aquí se presenta al Siervo de Dios que es totalmente inocente y carga con la culpa de todos, como chivo expiatorio. El sufrimiento del inocente es preocupante. Siempre presenta preguntas incómodas y difíciles de contestar. Si Dios causa sufrimiento o lo permite sin culpa por parte del que sufre, es que es injusto. Si no puede evitar el sufrimiento, es que Dios es impotente. En ambos casos, amenaza la idea de un Dios justo y poderoso. Se presenta aquí un Siervo de Dios que asume el sufrimiento del mundo y lo acepta voluntariamente, para poder llevar a muchos al conocimiento y el amor de Dios, a la salvación.

Hebreos 4:14-16

En esta lectura se nos presenta a un sumo sacerdote que comprende los sufrimientos y las debilidades del pueblo, porque los ha sufrido. Hay aquí una confesión de la comunidad sobre la identidad de Jesús, Hijo de Dios y Sumo Sacerdote. Así como el sumo sacerdote entró a la presencia de Dios y ofreció sacrificios, Cristo, por su propia sangre, pasó a la presencia de Dios después de su Pasión y Muerte.

Marcos 10:35-45

A pesar de los anuncios que ha hecho Jesús sobre su propia Pasión, los discípulos aún no lo entendían. Se hace difícil pertenecer a esta comunidad, donde unos aspiran a tener los primeros puestos y otros se irritan ante la ambición. Los discípulos, como todos los humanos, están tentados de egoísmo, vanidad, deseo de poder, y ambición. Por otro lado, tienen celos y envidias. Cuando Jesús responde a la pretensión de Santiago y Juan de sentarse en los primeros puestos, afirma que no está en su mano conceder esos puestos, aunque no niega que él vaya a sentarse a la derecha de Dios. Afirma así que en el reino no hay puestos de honor; pero sí que quienes quieren seguirle tienen que pasar por la misma suerte por la que él pasó, es decir, ser sumergido en las aguas y beber el cáliz de Jesús. Participar en la Muerte y Resurrección de Jesús entraña entrega y en la mayoría de las veces sacrificio, servicio y generosidad, no prestigio.

Nuestra cultura

Quisiéramos, como la mamá de Santiago y Juan, ver a nuestros hijos en los mejores puestos, en puestos de honor. Es normal. Queremos que tengan premios, que se distingan en la escuela, que cuando sean profesionales alcancen los puestos más altos en sus empresas. Eso nos llena de orgullo; pero, a muchos padres también les podría llenar de orgullo tener un hijo que se entrega en cuerpo y alma al servicio de los demás.

PREGUNTAS PARA LA SEMANA

¿Insisto en mantener mi superioridad sobre los demás? ¿Qué cambios en mi comportamiento son necesarios para que abandone tales pretensiones de poder?



TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Santiago y Juan, además de ser hermanos, eran tipos muy atrevidos. Se acercaron a Jesús para pedirle puestos de poder y autoridad en el Reino que estaba estableciendo. Al darse cuenta, los demás discípulos se molestaron con ellos, probablemente porque deseaban los mismos puestos. La tentación y el deseo de poder es algo muy común a todos los seres humanos. Todos deseamos el primer puesto y la estima de los demás. No obstante, Jesús nos recuerda que no es fácil tener responsabilidad. La autoridad es un cáliz difícil de beber ya que muchas veces contiene una bebida amarga y el peso o decisión de ser fieles al Evangelio, aún a costa de la propia vida.

Por tal motivo, la persona que quiera estar cerca de Jesús tendrá que aprender a ser como Cristo, quien no vino a imponer su autoridad buscando ser servido, sino que vino a servir. Él, siendo Dios, no se aferró a su condición divina, sino que se hizo uno de tantos, cuidando a su madre por muchos años, juntándose con pecadores, lavando los pies a sus discípulos y dando la vida por todas las personas. Estar al lado de Jesús no es cuestión de poder, sino de amor y servicio, hasta dar la vida. Él nos puso el ejemplo.


VIRTUS
